

House Rep Votes Education Bills

HB563: School Choice and EOA Accounts
HB51: Prohibit penalties for daycares/schools that don't require masking. Require acceptance of exemption from any gov't COVID medical mandate: test, mask, vax (by schools). This bill ONLY passed the house and was never brought to the floor for a vote in the Senate
SB1: (SB138 was rolled into SB1). Shifted principal hiring and curriculum decisions away from School-Based Decision-Making Councils to the local district superintendent. SB 1, through its merger with SB 138, also addressed – in an indirect way – widespread public concern about CRT by improving the state's social studies standards. Rather than restricting CRT, SB 1 stipulated certain concepts that should be included in Kentucky social studies classrooms, including a set of important historical documents that previously did not appear in the state's standards.
HB63: School Resource Officers are required in EVERY school and if a district can't do this by August 2022 they will need to work with the state school security marshal to implement a plan to do so
HB9: (Charter School Bill) This bill created a funding mechanism for charter schools so that the funding follows the child. It also created a pilot project which ensures at least two charters will open in Louisville and Northern KY.
HB208: Forced Districts Back to the Classroom a minimum of 2 days a week in March 2021
SB128: Allow public high school students to request to use the 2021-2022 school year as a supplemental school year to retake and supplement coursework already completed; require local boards of education to either approve or deny all requests; ensure students utilizing supplemental school years are not ineligible to participate in KHSAA activities
